



OUTSTANDING YOUTH INDIVIDUAL OR GROUP PHILANTHROPY AWARD

Purpose

AFP Central Ontario Chapter has established a Youth Individual or Group in Philanthropy Award to be presented in recognition of outstanding volunteerism and leadership by youth.

Individual and Group

This award recognizes service by an individual ages 10–23 who demonstrate outstanding commitment to the community through direct financial support, development of charitable programs, volunteering, and leadership in philanthropy. Nominees will be judged based on work done while they were 10–23 years old.

One of the Chapter's central roles is to broaden the public's awareness of the value of philanthropy. Additionally, the Chapter feels a responsibility to foster coming generations of volunteers, donors, and professionals in the charitable sector. By establishing this award, the chapter hopes to serve both aims, while giving richly deserved recognition to the efforts of youth, who are involved in philanthropic activities.

Eligibility & Nomination Criteria

An individual member of AFP Central Ontario Chapter or a representative of a charitable organization may submit a nomination for this award.

List the nominee's achievements, including:

1. Description of what the nominee did and the results that were achieved. (Can include goals, process, budget (if relevant) and other people involved in the process (adult leaders or adviser).
2. Description of the impact the nominee had on the community, including numbers of people involved, financial impact, organizations helped, etc. Please include the names and contact information of individuals at the organizations who benefited from the nominee's work.
3. Outline the potential for the long term (1-5 years) impact of the nominee's work. Will the project(s) be ongoing and has the nominee considered next steps or is working on other projects? Can the project be easily replicated and if so, how?

Submission Criteria

Each nomination should include the nomination form, the narrative, and any supporting documents. The narrative should be no longer than 3 pages. *Supporting documents (no more than six (6) pages) are accepted, but only to support the narrative.* No new information to be introduced in the supporting documents.

The Awards Selection Committee, chaired by the Past President of AFP Central Ontario Chapter, will be asked to review candidates based on the eligibility criteria set out above. If in the judgment of the Committee, no applicants meet the criteria, no award will be given in this category.
